HIGHLY PRODUCTIVE LAND ASSESSMENTS FOR DEVELOPMENT PROPOSALS

In September 2022, the Government introduced a new National Policy Statement for Highly Productive Land (NPS-HPL). This directive aims to counteract the significant loss of land to urban or rural residential development, particularly in regions surrounding Auckland and Christchurch. While this legislation has created surprises and headaches for planners, developers, and landowners alike, it importantly ensures the availability of New Zealand's most favourable soils for food and fibre

production for future generations.

We have been conducting agricultural productivity assessments to support development proposals where we aim to facilitate informed decision-making and sustainable development practices in these areas.





We've tipped over the 3,500 hectares of Emissions Trading Scheme (ETS) forestland submitted and registered for farmers in New Zealand. The map illustrates the locations of all our carbon clients.

Our approach enables us to operate nationwide and ensures optimal outcomes for ETS assessments. This achievement represents a fraction of the potential carbon opportunities available, particularly for hill country farmers with naturally regenerating native forests. Within the next five years, we anticipate that most farms will have seized the financial benefits offered by carbon farming.

Agri Intel's carbon services have rapidly evolved into comprehensive ETS management and compliance solutions, gaining significant popularity. Key services include:

- ETS assessments and registration.
- Forestland and compliance management.
- Carbon stock measurements.
